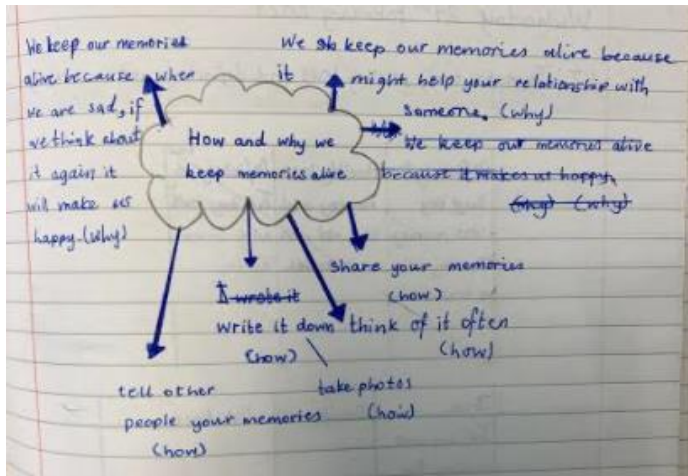

Julia wrote adverbial phrases, and then experimented with placing them at different points in the sentence.

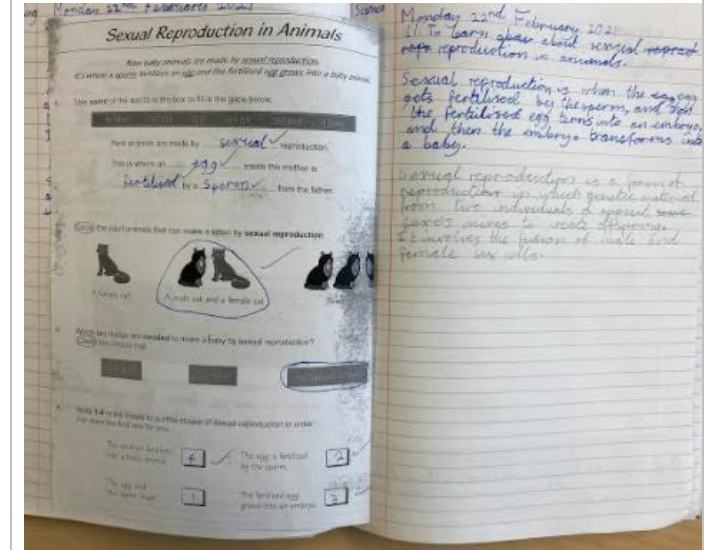
Maths
