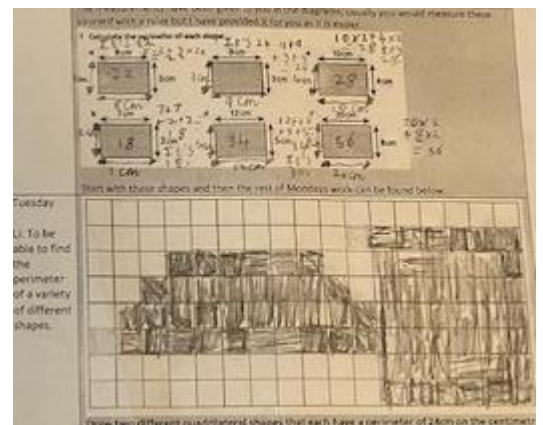
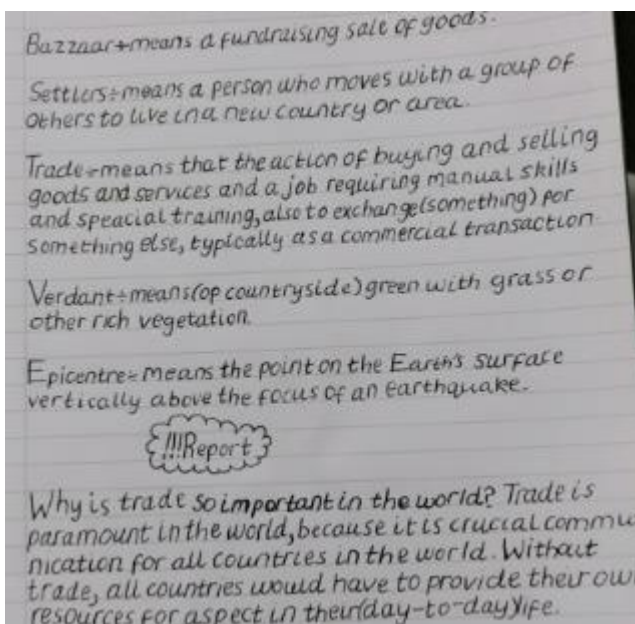


# Year 4

Nifemi's reading, she has produced a brilliant report.

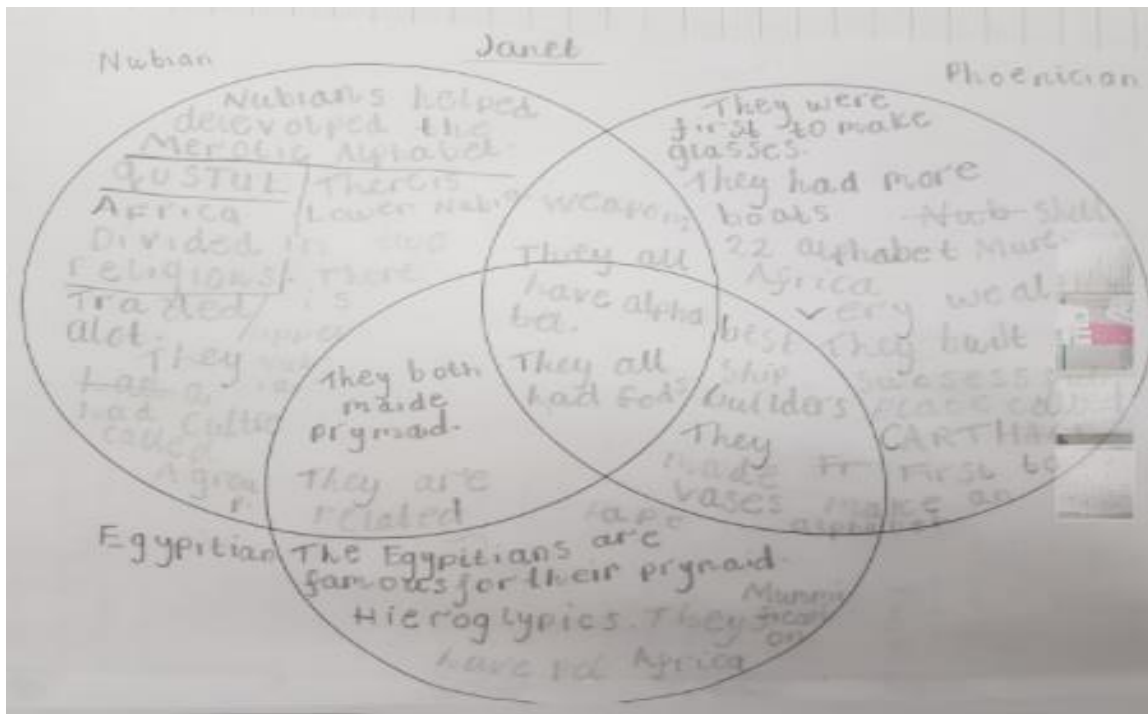

The perimeter of the 6<sup>th</sup> polygon is 14cm

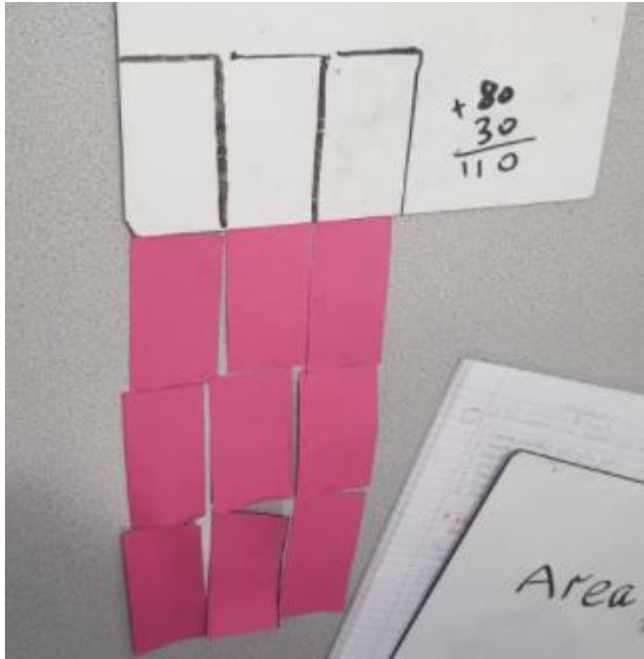
Lillian's mathematics from the beginning of the week, showing that she has really understood perimeter.
