What we will learn	Nursery- A time to settle into our new school and discover what our amazing body can do and how we can use simple words to say how we feel and who is important to us especially in our family. We will learn about the parts of the body through body related We will look at the 'People Who Help Us' - our family, people in the school community as well as in the local area.	Nursery -We will look at different festivals that use colour and light. The children will focus on the use of colour both manmade and in the natural world. The children will be encouraged to explore and talk about what they observe when using colours in different media and materials as well as in their colour mixing activities.	Nursery - Our children will be familiar with at least 1 fairy tale/nursery rhyme and act out the main events. They will be able to talk about main characters. We will observe seasonal change and develop our questioning skills. We will help the children to plant and care for easy to grow vegetables such as beans, cress.
