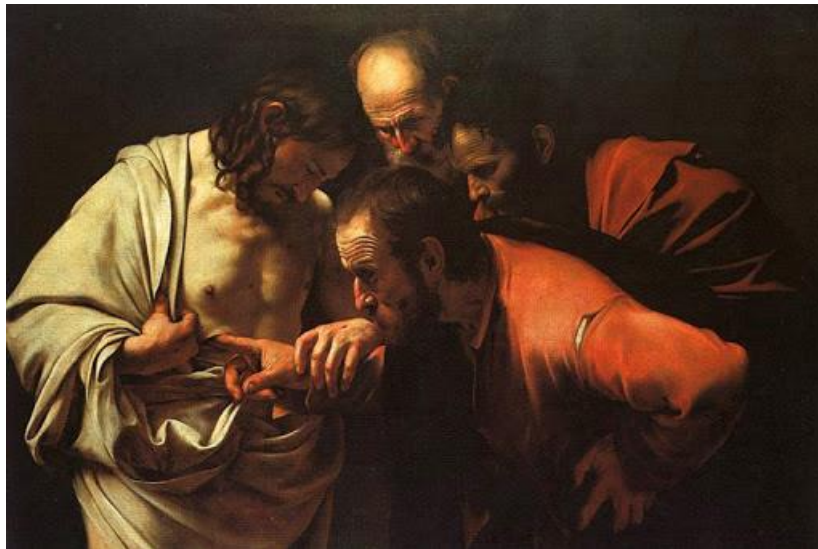
St Thomas

St Thomas the Apostle was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus according to the New Testament. Thomas is commonly known as "Doubting Thomas" because he doubted Jesus' resurrection when first heard of it; later, when he realised that Jesus really had risen from the dead he is famous for the saying, "My Lord and my God," on seeing Jesus' crucifixion wounds. After Pentecost, St. Thomas is believed to have widely travelled to preach the Good News eventually getting as far as India, where he died in 72 A.D.

Pope Francis said about St Thomas: He 'shows us that every doubt can lead to an outcome brighter than any uncertainty'. That's faith!

St. Thomas is the patron of architects and builders.
