
Personal, Social & Emotional Development

- Talking about how the characters behave in the stories and why.
- Discussing characters' perspectives and feelings, fostering empathy, and understanding.
- Understanding how others may feel in different situations.
- Promoting friendship skills by encouraging children to play together and resolve conflicts peacefully.
- Exploring the theme of teamwork through stories and collaborative tasks such as making the farm role play area.

Physical Development

- Developing our GROSS MOTOR SKILLS by practising throwing and aiming skills in outdoor throwing games, promoting coordination and spatial awareness – WHAT ELSE AS THIS IS A PRIME AREA?
- Developing our FINE MOTOR SKILLS strengthening finger muscles through activities SUCH AS ????



Communication & Language

- Farm role-play with costumes and masks.
- Retelling stories and rhymes using the masks and costumes.

Maths

- Counting in order and beyond 1-5 in various contexts, like cleanup or outdoor activities.
- Sorting and counting objects into groups based on colours and sizes.
- Using different containers to explore volume and weight, fostering understanding of mathematical concepts.
- Creating and extending simple patterns using everyday objects or materials.
- Promoting simple mathematical language.

Understanding the World

- Encouraging discussions about past experiences.
- Growing herbs and vegetables to learn about plant growth and care so fostering appreciation for nature.
- Exploring the concept of the life cycle of ?????
- Creating simple picture maps of character journeys
- Role-play areas home area and farm.
- Learning about animals in traditional stories and through hands-on exploration on our day trip to the farm

Literacy

- Active participation during story time, including repeating phrases, predicting story outcomes, and discussing favourite parts.
- Turn-taking during book sharing sessions, reading aloud, and asking questions about the story.
- Drawing, painting, and creating simple written texts like posters, birthday cards, and informative books.
- Activities like labelling personal belongings or playing games with name cards to recognize their names.
